#TextbookBrokeAB has taken up the majority of my time this month, however, it has proven to be a highly successful initiative. In collaboration with the VP Academics from the other CAUS schools, we were able to engage students, faculty and politicians across the province. The University of Lethbridge installment of the campaign was very successful. We set up a table outside of the bookstore during rush week and encouraged students to stop and talk to us about how much they had spent on textbooks this semester. We then asked them to write their total on a whiteboard and pose for a photo. These photos were then shared on social media with the hashtag #TextbookBrokeAB and distributed to appropriate politicians to increase awareness surrounding textbook cost inflation and to draw attention to Open Educational Resources as an alternative. We also conducted a survey here at the U of L and got a lot of responses so next time we conduct this campaign talk about affordable and accessible recourses on campus we tangible results to base claims off of.

Grade Appeal Assistance

I have been quite busy this month assisting with student grade appeals. The individual cases are highly confidential therefore, I am unable to go into specific detail regarding each one.

Chinook Award Consultations

This year due to the minimum wage changes the money allocated to the Chinook Awards also needed to be increased. Since this award is associated with the Students' Union Royal, Hailey and I were involved with the consultations with Eramus Okine, the Vice President Research, of where the extra money should be allocated from. We analyzed many different situations to see how we could get the money allocated to go as far as it could. We have figured out a way in which the award can be sustained for the next few years, and will keep discussing what the long term solution to sustain the award will be.

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Guide to Student Rights and Responsibilities

I have been working on a Guide to Student Rights and Responsibility throughout my term as Vice President Academic. This is an initiative to ensure that students know what is expected of them, and for students to know what they can expect from their professors.
