### **Reports**

# **CAUS** Counterparts

During CAUS Counterparts I met with the VPAs and other Executive Council Members from the University of Alberta, McEwan University, University of Calgary, and Mount Royal Students' Unions and Associations.

I found that many aspects of the other VPAs portfolios differed from my own and that there are some position requirements at their institutions that I would like to see the VPA at the ULSU also have in their portfolio. For example, at many of their Students' Unions/Associations, the VPA is a coordinator between Representatives and the Executive Council. They assist them with preparing for meetings and aid them where needed.

### Strategic Planning

Daan Smit our VP Operations and Finance led a meeting with all the Executive Members of the ULSU and presented us with insightful information on how to develop a strategic plan for the ULSU. The most recent plan expired over 2 year ago and we are in desperate need for a new one. I have been a part of the Strategic Planning process for organizations I have volunteered with over the years and can not wait to get started on one for the ULSU.

Policy 7.21.1 states that the membership of the Students' Union Strategic Planning Committee consists of the President, 2 additional members of the Executive Council, 2 General Assembly Members, and the General Manager (as required). Together the Executive Council agreed that we should wait for September when all General Assembly members are afforded the equal chance to join this committee. Therefore, we will start the process of creating a strategic plan in a couple of months.

### Lethbridge College Students' Association Meet and Greet

Nicholas Coley who is the President of the LCSA met with us this month. Unfortunately, the other two executive members of the LCSA were unable to attend this meeting. All the ULSU Executives and Nicholas had an open discussion about our goals for the year and how we can support one another this Academic Year.

Earlier this year (before May), I was speaking for the Schizophrenia Society of Alberta at Lethbridge College and talked in brief about the Early Alert System I am hoping to establish at ULeth. A member of LCSA approached me following the speech and stated their interest in programs like these on campus. Once I have my preliminary research prepared for Early Alert, I will send it to LCSA to see if the Representative I talked to is still interested in working on this initiative with me.

### Whitney Balog – Sexual Violence Prevention Coordinator

The ULSU Executive Council (noticing a theme yet?) met with Whitney Balog to discuss our positions and goals for the year to see how they would line up with her own.

I talked to Whitney about which committees have been struck by her position and the possibility of having ULSU Executives or Reps having a seat on these committees.



### Health and Safety Meeting

The Executive Council met with members from the Health and Safety Team and departments/services associated with them. Again, I talked about Early Alert, to which I learnt it that there has been attempts to make something similar in the past and that the University is looking to implement a program like this for our campus. Health and Safety will be a major component of this program should it be launched, and I am looking forward to meeting individually with members of all the teams that help keep our campus safe.

### Golden Key International Honour's Society

The ULSU will not be hosting Golden Key International Honour's Society as a club. It was decided that other than Greek and ORS that we would keep our mandate of inclusivity in clubs. That being said there will still be a chapter formed on campus and I am looking forward to reading about their accomplishments and impact on the student body they will have.

#### Dr. Wismath – Dean of the School of Liberal Education

I met with Dr. Wismath to discuss further how the ULSU can be involved in events run by the School of Liberal Education. Additionally, we talked about the LBED1500 Mapping the First Year Experience course and how the ULSU could be incorporated into a lecture of this class so that we can present to first year students what the services and goals of the ULSU are.

Additionally, I learnt of committees and councils that would be formed with the School, and the possibility of ULSU Representation on these committees.

#### **VPA** Initiatives

#### Representation on University of Lethbridge Committees

Bylaw 6.2.1.1 of the ULSU states that the VPA "shall seek to gain student representation on appropriate University of Lethbridge Committees if such representation does not exist".

I've been in talks with Whitney Balog and Dr. Wismath as mentioned above to add ULSU Representatives to committees that they oversee.

### Academic Speaker Series – Shaun Boothe

Shaun Boothe will be the first Academic Speaker for the 2018/2019 year! His unique take on presenting on leadership by rapping about the strengths that historical leaders around the world have had will be a welcomed addition to the Fresh Fest Recognition dinner. This dinner is a closed event designed for volunteers of Fresh Fest, but other speakers will be open for all students throughout the year.

I have attached the information sheet to this report, so you can read about Shaun Boothe and why I would like to bring him to this event to encourage leadership in our volunteers that make Fresh Fest amazing.


Grade Appeals, Student Discipline, and Other Student Concerns of an Academic Nature
