Meet & Greet with Brian Jean

On Thursday, June 1st, I attended a Meet & Greet with Brian Jean in Lethbridge, Alberta. This event was organized by the local constituency offices, and Mr. Jean travelled from Edmonton to attend. During the event, Mr. Jean talked about the unity agreement, and answered questions from those in attendance. I asked Mr. Jean about mental health funding, and what a United Conservative Government under his leadership would do to ensure stable and predictable mental health funding. Mr. Jean stated that he was aware of our situation at the University of Lethbridge, and that mental health funding is an important priority for him. After the event, I was able to talk to Justin Ferguson, Mr. Jean's Senior Advisor, and Kimberly Lyall, who is president of the Lethbridge East Wildrose constituency organization, about setting up a meeting and inviting Mr. Jean to campus.

Lethbridge Unity Town Hall with Jason Kenney and MLA Drew Barnes

On Tuesday, June 13th, I attended the Jason Kenney Lethbridge Unity Town Hall. During this town hall, I was able to talk to MLA Drew Barnes about CAUS and issues that directly impact students. During the Q and A period, I was able to ask Mr. Kenney about the seventh founding principle in the Agreement in Principle, which states, "high quality publicly-funded education that maintains Alberta's successful model of school choice." I asked Mr. Kenney if this point included post-secondary education, and if it did, why was post-secondary education not a separate point? Mr. Kenney responded by saying that it is a broad agreement, and they could not get into specific policy. I then asked Mr. Kenney what he would do to support predictable and sustainable mental health funding for Alberta post-secondary institutions if he was to become Premier, he answered by stating that he supports mental health initiatives, but could not go into specifics. He also said that he wants to focus on the colleges and polytechnics as well. I was able to talk to Mr. Kenney about a follow-up meeting, and I will be in contact with Mr. Barnes about a follow up meeting as well.

Pride Flag Raising

On Friday, June 16th, Me, Sandeep, Tracey, and Cheri attended the raising of the Pride flag on campus. It was great to see that happen, and the turnout for the raising of the pride flag was fantastic.

CAUS in-person meeting in Calgary, Alberta

On Monday, June 19th, Me, Hailey, Sandeep, and Royal drove to Calgary and stayed the night for multiple events, including the CAUS in person meeting at the University of Calgary, the Wellness summit, and the mental health announcement. Wellness Summit 2017: Healthy Campus Alberta/ Mental Health Announcement

The next day, on Tuesday, June 20th, we attended the 2017 Wellness Summit, hosted by Healthy Campus Alberta. Overall, the event was great, and the sessions were very informative. Also, Hon. Marlin Schmidt, the Minister of Advanced Education, and Hon. Brandy Payne, the Associate Minister of Health, were in attendance for an announcement surrounding Mental Health funding. The announcement was a three year, \$25.8 million dollar commitment to Mental Health. As Vice Chair of CAUS, I was able to talk to Bill Moore-Kilgannon, Minister Schmidt's Chief of Staff, and Minister Schmidt about the announcement. Minister Schmidt and Associate Minister Payne outlined seven steps for improving post-secondary mental health, which include:

- 1. Providing equitable funding to publicly funded post-secondary institutions.
- 2. Defining roles of post-secondary and public health systems in improving post-secondary student mental health.
- 3. Integrating on-campus mental health supports with larger regional systems. This includes a three-year transition period, where there will be no reduction in mental health funding.
- 4. Providing a one-time, two-year grant opportunity to support Indigenous post-secondary students' mental health.
- 5. Funding Healthy Campus Alberta Community of Practice
- 6. Improving access to 24-hour universal supports throughout the province.
- 7. Reviewing student aid policies.

Senate Recognition Dinner

As a new senator on the University of Lethbridge Senate, I was invited to the Senate recognition dinner by Chancellor Janice Varzari. It was a great opportunity to talk to current senators and senior administration.

Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA) Federal Policy Committee

This month, I have had two teleconference meetings as part of my commitment to the Federal Policy committee, which I was elected to serve. We have a number of policies up for renewal, and I look forward to working on them.
