Municipal Election Preparation

On October 16, there was a Lethbridge Municipal election. Traditionally, students who live in a city only for the purpose of attending a post-secondary institution and do not live in that city as permanent residents have not been allowed to vote in a municipal election. Conner, the ULSU VP External, was able to work with the city to allow U of L residents to vote in the election this year. This is very important to a number of residents, including myself, who spend more time in Lethbridge during the school year than their hometown over the summer. Having an opportunity for my constituents to have their voice heard where they spend at least 8 months of the year is important. I worked with Housing Services to ensure any on-campus residents who wanted to vote had proof of residency in Lethbridge and were able to vote.

The noise from the construction has created noise complaints from some of my constituents living in UHall as work starts early in the morning and can run late into the night to ensure the project finishes on time.
