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
### **Reports**

#### New Student Orientation + Goose Chase

This year for NSO the ULSU held an event called Goose Chase. When Jessica Jones (VPSA) went to a conference in the summer they had a scavenger hunt all week. The Goose Chase app allows an organization to make challenges which can range from straight up trivia, require photo or video proof that you completed them, and even use GPS to ensure you are in the right location. Jessica, Jon Davidson (A&S Rep), a few others, and I spent hours coming up with over 200 questions for students to answer. In collaboration with other services on campus, such as Enrolment, over 1200 Students signed up over the course of the week.
