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

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# **Fresh Fest Report**

## Fresh Fest 2018

## <u>May 2018</u>

Beginning of the term for myself, first thing that we did was compose our budget for this year's Fresh Fest with consideration to the changes we decided to make this year, making it a two day concert, removing both Fresh Flix and the Luau from our roster and focusing in more on our concert and cabaret. We also altered the Packages and removed them outright and instead making them an add-on option at the till, which may need some refining in the next year. This changes I think were mostly a positive, I feel like we have a lot of fanny packs remaining so it may be in the next years' committee's best interest to buy a much more reduced # of fanny packs, shirts, etc. or maybe just sell shirts we had way too many of them kicking around this year and while they were a lot of fun it's hard to get rid of them now.

We also hired our FF team during this month, we also changed up the arrangement with that as well, with 2 head coordinators (events/jamboree and volunteer) and 4 assistants (two for each). I liked this arrangement quite a bit, having no experience before I can't speak to how it was before but it was quite a positive in my books as we had more people to delegate to, more people to supervise, and more to fill in when things started to hit the fan. There's the potential for conflict with this system if you have very eager assistants that work to the same level as your coordinator, but I didn't see that problem during this year. It was in May I learned about Ahead of the Herd (AOTH) which is something I wish I had realized was happening sooner. Book your SU Atrium table stat! get volunteers ASAP! And give students a reason to stop! But I'll get more into that into June.

#### <u>June 2018</u>

So on the 2nd of June is AOTH, in my brain I had rationalized it out to be much later than it was. So as I said in May, get ready! I had set up a table in the SU Atrium with a laptop for the new students to sign up to learn about tickets via email as soon as they released! We also made use of old swag to give out so students would feel enticed to come and talk Fresh Fest with us. I also ran the presentation to the parents about services on campus and made sure to include a bit on Fresh Fest and how it's a great opportunity for students to meet other students and grow their community.



During this month I headed to COCA with Riley where we would spend the week seeking out talent for FF, our luck would have it so we would find a deal with two bands that cooperated together nicely would help us save a few bucks to spend towards more talent. Returning back to Alberta after that week (feel free to refer back to the COCA report for more details) I had a great deal of information that I would use for the Sponsorship Packages with Daan, new perspectives regarding our artists, and a newfound confidence in myself (which I would lose months later).

With regards to Sponsorship I would refer back to the packages we made this year, I think they are going to be received a lot better. If I can pass any advice with regards to Sponsorship, it is have more resources that are pre-made that can be customized such as contracts, information with regards to what's available and what they need to bring (load-in times etc.), and where possible continue the communication through the year and approach last year's sponsors first! Relationship is key with regards to sponsor. Also find a way to make the bronze and silver packages worth it.

Talent was its own mess of worms as we were cycling through artists as quickly as I'd learn about a new one we were contacting a new one. I found relying on Riley during the pertinent time to be critical, he nailed down the right artist even when I was second guessing it myself. This event would be nothing without Riley.

During this month we'd also do our best to launch Fresh Fest, I'm happy that this year we were able to launch in July rather than August. I believe it was a good launch and I believe the reception for the two-day festival was well received among students.

## August 2018

The final countdown was on and it was on us to ensure our food vendors were secured, all the work orders were put in, checking on everyone to ensure everyone held to their tasks and finish up the crafts. I'm grateful for my team as things felt as they almost fell into place as we worked through the month. The week before got a little crazy as we had last minute trying to get decorations made and painted and set up in time, stuffing packages with T-shirts (which in hindsight, just don't do!) and ensuring that volunteers got in on time for move-in on the Sunday before Welcome Week.

## September 2018

So this is where all the pieces would come together. I was very grateful for the amount of people on our team. We had enough people to cover two tables for ticket sales and package pick-up, handle the last minute details and keep the event running like a well-oiled machine. Be prepared with the tents to take twine and tie them down as we had at least one tent damaged and another broken in half. We were also lucky as we had no incidents at Fresh Fest this year.

Fresh Fest Recognition was another thing altogether as well, I'm not sure if the date or the time was off or if is something worth doing anymore. We had many of our volunteers come out, however we still were not able to fill up Ballroom B. I think it was a



very cool experience to have everyone come out and experience Shaun Boothe, receive recognition, and get a full meal out of the night but I would like to find more ways to pull more students and even new students out to the dinner so more students can benefit from participating with Fresh Fest.

#### So what would be the things I'd change for next year?

There's a lot and a lot I learned and that I'd like to grow and improve for future Fresh Fest attendees. That being said I'm so incredibly proud of the concert we held and I want to say it was the best Fresh Fest I've ever attended, I might be a little biased though.

The first thing I'd change is preparing for AOTH because I was totally blindsided by how quickly the event came up and past. I'd just ensure that there was a plan to have new students sign up for a mail notification for the ticket release launch. I was scrambling for a day before this event trying to put together a nice powerpoint, new signs for the table, decorations, some swag to put on the table, and a mail chimp when I really should have had this all together way before this date.

The second thing I'd change would be the merchandise, I loved doing it but honestly with how few t-shirts we sold I wouldn't say it'd be worth purchasing more than 100 t-shirts and 100 lemons just to give out as prizing or have as an optional add-on. The fanny pack idea was well-loved but I guess students didn't see the value. Maybe if you bring back the fanny packs then to bring in a higher quality fanny pack.

Third I would love to create more content for Sponsors, I think we made a great start this year but I think creating more content for Sponsors such as contracts for each tier of sponsor, creating a document or a letter that encompasses everything sponsors will have to bring or what will be available for them, creating thank you letters, and so on. I'll have to leave some examples for the next VPSA and the next VP OP-FI so maybe we can break our goal of \$10,000 and maybe hit something closer to \$15,000-\$20,000 which may make a huge difference for our artist budget.

While I loved doing crafts this year and made a bit of a dent in updating old signs by starting partway through August I would just recommend that you just start in May-June since the likelihood of getting volunteers anytime during the summer is rather slim. I found it's just not worth doing it during the most stressful time of the summer, especially when you're trying to expand your selection of events in the first week.

I'd love to see a return of some non-drinking events such as the Luau. I know ORS tried to run an event in place and I'm not sure if that went through but as someone who really enjoyed it in my second and third year I'd like to see it reinstated with the reopening of the Breezeway. I don't know the feasibility of it since our volunteers are very busy but it may have a place sometime in the week and we may be able to collaborate with ORS again!

## **Final Thoughts**

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Lastly, I'm so incredibly grateful for my team and how things came together for the concert. I'm so happy the two-day concert came together so well and I'm looking forward to see how Fresh Fest will grow from here. I would love to come back to do this all over again whether that's as a volunteer, a committee member or as an elected somebody but if I don't, I hope what I learned from my experience can be passed down to the next VPSA and they can make this Fresh Fest greater than ours!
