# United Way Poverty Simulation Volunteering

On Thursday, February 27th I had the privilege to volunteer with the United Way Poverty Simulation for students within the Faculty of Health Sciences. The goal of this simulation is to give Health Sciences students a greater understanding of the complexity of poverty, and to destigmatize the struggles many individuals in poverty face. I played the role of the pawn shop owner and it was my responsibility to bring light to the discrimination individuals living in poverty may face by being rude and disrespecting individuals visiting the pawn shop, and buying items from families trying to make money as I saw fit. My role helped to identify how challenging it is to simply provide for one's family while simultaneously coping with pressure to function in society.
