Descriptions of Notable Meetings and Events

Penguin Protest

Myself along with the help of a General Assembly member went and built an army of protesting snow penguins outside of MLA Nathan Neudorfs office in opposition to rising tuition rates and incoming budget cuts. Demonstrations happened across the province and created a large amount of media attention which made cuts to Post-Secondary Institutions a leading story for that week and was a COVID friendly way of showing opposition to the cuts.

Student Leader Meeting with Advanced Education Minister

This meeting with the Minister involved members from Universities, Colleges, and Polytechnics from across the province and was mainly a meeting which was held in order for us to talk specifically about tuition increases with the minister and how we would prefer to see tuition handled in a more affordable and predictable way for students. We brought up concerns with regards to tuition deregulation and discussed potential other avenues of how to make University more affordable for students.

Provincial Budget

The Provincial budget was released on Feb 25th and we now know that the University of Lethbridge will be receiving a cut of 5.8% which equates to about 5.7 million dollars. We are very opposed to this decision and expressed our concerns and frustration in a meeting with the minister that night. We also have yet to see the final budget line for funding of programs related ot Campus Sexual Violence and we have continually tried to get information on this budget line but we have been told to wait for the Alberta 2030 review in April.

CAUS Organization and public outreach committee

This Committee is the one which organizes the larger advocacy efforts that we have been taking province wide and has a lot of very fun and exciting plans for March! Stay tuned to find out what they might be!

Ongoing Projects and Tasks
