Internal to the ULSU

Meetings with Students (40 hours): November is historically a busy month in the role of VPA when it comes to student concerns. Due to confidentiality, I will not be describing the contents of these meetings.

ULSU Executive Council Meetings (2×2 hours): If you are interested in hearing about what was discussed in these meeting, I can supply you with meeting minutes from any meeting.

ULSU General Assembly Meeting (2 x 2 hours): This is our monthly meeting to go over what members of the ULSU have been doing in their roles, go over any pressing ULSU matters, and discuss any relevance issues and events occurring on campus.

Legislative Review Committee (1.5 hours): This committee is meant to review the bylaws and policies of the ULSU.

EDIA Committee (0.5 hours)

Indigenous Relations Committee (2 hours): I attended this meeting for collaboration between this committee and the Mental Health Wellness Committee. We will be debuting a mental health wellness feedback form that Indigenous students can fill out to better guide student groups (ULSU, AMR, etc.) on advocating for Indigenous students.

Committees External to the ULSU

General Faculties Council (GFC) Library Meeting (1 hour): This is a subcommittee of GFC that acts as a advisory group for the U of L Library.

GFC Meeting (2 hours): This is a monthly committee that meets to discuss and decide on academic matters at an institutional level. I sit as one of the ten undergraduate representatives

Admissions Standard Committee (2.5 hours): This committee to meets to go over admissions at the U of L, both generally and within certain programs.

Senate Honorary Degree Committee (4 hours): While this meeting only was 1.5 hours long, there was significant review of honorary degree applications that I needed to do in preparation. This committee is a subcommittee of Senate that grants honorary degrees to individuals that have contributed significantly to their field, have contributed significantly to philanthropy, or has contributed significantly to the community of Lethbridge, southern Alberta, Alberta as a whole, or Canada.

Arts and Science Faculty Council (2 hours): This is a monthly meeting between administration of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences, faculty and staff, and student representatives as well as other stakeholders on campus. During this faculty council meeting, we discussed curriculum changes, introduced the new Associate Dean, and discussed future plans within the faculty.

Teaching Centre Advisory Council (now renamed to Teaching and Innovation Advisory Council) (2 hours): As mentioned in the teaching of the committee, this is a group that assists with the Teaching Centre on campus with the development of teaching resources on various topics, promoting teaching excellence on campus, and encouraging and assisting with innovative ways of teaching and learning. I am the undergraduate student representative on this council.

Deputy Provost Search Committee (2 x 2 hours + 6 hour preparation time): Currently, the U of L is hiring for the Deputy Provost position. I am currently sitting on the committee as a student representative. There is a significant amount of preparation time commitment to this.

Education Faculty Council (2 hours): This is a semi-monthly meeting between administration of the Faculty of Education, faculty and staff, and student representatives as well as other stakeholders on campus. During this faculty council meeting, we discussed curriculum changes, introduced the new Dean, and discussed future plans within the education faculty.
