Iikaisskini Gathering Place Gift Announcement

Toni Pashe, the ULSU Indigenous Representative, and I were invited to this gift announcement at the beginning of the month. Thanks to contributions from the ICIP and TD Bank Financial Group, the likaisskini Gathering Place will be moved from the Paterson Center to a central place in University Hall. Though this move presents the opportunity to be more accessible to students on campus, it also presents the loss of some benefits the current location possesses. Several General Assembly members and I are looking into what options might exist for the gathering place in the future regarding this.

Senate

I, as well as several ULSU members, serve on the University of Lethbridge Senate. For this first meeting of the senate in the fall, we had a presentation focusing on updates regarding COVID-19 on campus. Several breakout rooms were held, and I do think this was a very welcome addition to the proceedings, as it allowed people from all different fields to connect and discuss with one another. I was glad to see that a large portion of the Senate was very interested in connecting with our students in different forms. I understand that Richard Lee-Thai, VP Student Affairs, has made some strides in forming these connections between the Senate and the general student body.

Pathways Taskforce with GSA and ULFA

It has recently come into light that the University is considering a possible partnership with NAVITAS, an international private company focused on providing pathway programs. The GSA and ULSU have joined the ULFA's (University of Lethbridge Faculty Association) Pathway Taskforce to conduct research into this potential partnership and the partnerships this company has formed with post-secondary institutions around the world. This group also held a town hall for the members of all three associations in order to present some of our findings and concerns.
