May General Assembly Meeting: On Monday, May 6th the ULSU General Assembly held their first meeting of the year. Unfortunately I could not be there in person, but called in from my permanent residence in Ontario. At this meeting we discussed preliminary information regarding the logistics of the ULSU and campus as a whole to prepare for the new academic year.

Fresh Fest Luau: On Thursday, September 5th, I volunteered with the ULSU and ORS Fresh N’ Breezy Luau as a component of the Fresh Fest festivities. This event’s primary focus is to engage the diverse residence community by partnering with the Organization of Residence Students to provide a free and engaging activity to get individuals participating in their new school community. I helped to monitor the slip n’ slide, had engaging conversations with on campus residents, oversaw volunteers, and went doorknocking throughout University Hall to promote the event.

Club Rush Tabling: On Tuesday, September 10th I tabled for the ULSU during club rush week. During this meeting we approved monies to go towards the ORS/ULSU event “Let’s Talk About Sex” which I have had the privilege to be working on. In addition, we voted on several ULSU operating expenses and had fruitful discussion surrounding proposals brought forward from fellow students.

“Let’s Talk About Sex” Planning: As I currently serve as the Health Sciences Representative, I am determined to work on initiatives that support the overall well-being of our students here at the U of L. With “Let’s Talk About Sex” happening in mid October I had the pleasure to use my passion and education surrounding sexual health to devise an interactive session for this event.
